Minutes - The minutes from the last meeting were approved. It was moved by Byby and seconded by Keith.

Up Coming Events - There were many school tours - Paso Robles Continuation School, Monarch School from Los Osos, Corcoran Schools, Lockwood, San Miguel.

Maintenance - Les reported that things were OK.

Gift Shop - Gary reported we sold \$408.50 in books, etc. The posters have been laminated and are at the Paso Robles Inn, Railroad Depot, Chamber, Carnage, and some antique shops. Gary is going to keep a list of where they are.

Inventory - Glen talked to Barbara from the Parks and Rec about putting an article in the fall publication. Byby volunteered to write it by May 21st.

Pole Building - Bob reported he was still waiting. Ole will take the trees out when they are ready.

Skate Board Park - Bob reported that he attended a meeting about the design of the park and that they were considering locating it on the Riverside corner instead of the freeway side. Glen moved that we officially notify the City Council that we oppose the placement of the skate part on the Riverside corner. Paul seconded. Motion carried. Bob encouraged everyone to attend the city council meeting on Tuesday.

Carbide Pit - Paul reported that we were offered an acetylene generator but it was too large for the museum. Bonnie photographed it instead. Paul also reported that he would be borrowing some of the branding irons for Ag Day at Pleasant Valley School.

Wagons - Steve reported that the fair wanted to use some wagons for the fair. The board felt that it was a good idea since they load us tables, etc.

Tables - Les reported that we were missing a small table.

Boards - Gene Ernst offered to donate some redwood boards and beams. Yes, we were interested.

Stamps - Les reported we need some stamps to mark objects.


Docents - Joyce reported that we need more docents. Ways were discussed to find more.
