Needs: For the Council to review the request from Main Street to install new banners downtown

- Facts:**
1. Main Street has requested the City assist with installation of new brackets and banners on the decorative downtown streetlights. (see attached letter from Norma Moye)
 2. The City staff currently installs banners for various city events, Pioneer Day, Wine Festival, etc.
 3. The new brackets and banners will go on the decorative street light poles in the downtown area.

Analysis and

Conclusion: It is not a new work element to work with banners in the downtown area. City Public Works staff has routinely taken care of such banner placement for various events throughout the year. Main Street is looking to add new locations (downtown light poles) for banner placement.

Although the installation of the new brackets will be time consuming, staff feels that the work can be accomplished this fall without severe impact to other city work programs.

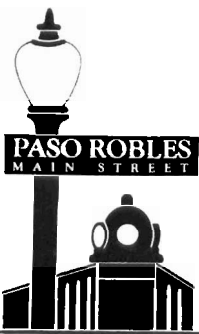
Fiscal
