	2. Proposition 50 sets aside \$525 million for allocation, by population, amongst all California counties, allocating approximately \$15 million for SLO County.		
	3. Staff representatives from twenty-five (25) local agencies have met several times to develop a Project List to earmark \$15 million in projects meeting grant definition guidelines for SLO County.		
ANALYSIS AND CONCLUSION:	 Proposition 50 has several overall funding principles: Projects must be completed by 2005 Funding distribution for each County is decided among its members All agencies must support the Project List In addition, each project on the list must be based and rated on the following criteria: Project addresses an identified public safety issue Project addresses an identified public safety issue Project addresses a negulatory Compliance Order Funding provides a match from another source Project is in a low-income or small community Project protects and/or entrances fish and wildlife habitat Project improves water quality Project is part of an adopted plan. The San Luis Obispo Group has met several times to develop a list of projects for funding romider and adopted plan. The San Luis Obispo Group has met several times to develop a list of projects for funding in the Proposition. The attached list is the result of the work completed by the SLO Group. The list must be submitted to Senator Bruce McPherson and Assembly Member Abel Maldonado with an accompanying Resolution by December 31, 2002 since apportionment of the funds to each County will be set aside at the beginning of the legislative session in January 2003. The project list is described as follows: List A – The SLO Group agreed to allocate \$2.7 million toward the Los Osos Wastewater Project. 		

 $\underline{\text{List B}} - \text{Each agency could receive $300,000 towards one project. The City of Paso Robles proposes to use their share to investigate an alternative disposal of its wastewater discharge. This project received the most points among the other agency representatives. The adopted Capital Improvement Program included this project, however, its funding was not identified.$

	Proposition 50 funds would allow this project to proceed with the first phase of work towards developing an alternative disposal of its wastewater discharge.		
	<u>List C</u> – This list was developed based on competition. The City of Paso Robles requested and received concurrence that \$300,000 was applicable towards implementing the prospective Storm Water Management Plan. In March 2003, the City will be required to implement certain programs to ensure that storm water run-off discharged to the Salinas River is meets regulatory requirements, generally referred to as "NPDES Phase II". The Regional Water Quality Control Board requires the City to address this issue in the following areas:
