On February 1, 2003, the Council developed and ranked a list of 32 goals. From the combined force ranking, there are seven major goals. 1. Develop a new source or sources of water 2. Complete the General Plan Update & the Chandler Ranch Area Specific Plan 3. Intensify economic development 4. Focus on airport development 5. Continue implementation of the Emergency Services Growth Management Plan 6. Implement the Downtown Parking & Circulation Plan 7. Improve transportation system/traffic flow.	The General Plan Update The Ad Hoc Committee has reviewed the City's General Plan and has established a series of recommendations for consideration. The Committee has found that no major policy revisions are needed.
