THE FIFTH ANNUAL RELAY FOR LIFE DAY

WHEREAS, cancer is expected to touch over one million families this year and an estimated 140,000 Californians will be diagnosed with cancer in the year 2002; and

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society is the nation's leading community-based voluntary health organization dedicated to eliminating cancer as a major health problem by preventing cancer, and diminishing suffering from cancer through research and education, advocacy, and service; and

WHEREAS, it has been proven that early detection and treatment significantly increase a person's chances for survival from cancer, and knowledge of the common symptoms of cancer should be thoroughly promulgated so as to save more lives by prompt medical attention; and

WHEREAS, the City of Paso Robles applauds the efforts of the Mission Oaks Unit of the American Cancer Society for the Relay for Life to be held on August 23rd and 24th at the Mid-State Fairgrounds where more than 750 local residents are expected to participate in the 24-hour relay to honor family and friends who have battled cancer, generating more than \$120,000 for the American Cancer Society.
