Needs:	For the City Council to hold a public hearing to consider adopting a Resolution to abandon a portion of 19 <sup>th</sup> Street, an 80-foot wide street, as shown on the attached Exhibit "A".
Facts:	<ol> <li>The portion of 19<sup>th</sup> Street being considered for abandonment lies between Pine Street and the Union Pacific Railroad. 19<sup>th</sup> Street at this location ends at the railroad right-of-way allowing no public through traffic.</li> </ol>
	2. The abandonment request was submitted by Eric Newton. The purpose of the request is to expand his residential uses.
	3. The Planning Commission at their meeting of November 23, 2004 recommended approval of the abandonment request.
	4. The City Council, at their meeting on December 21, 2004, adopted "Resolution of Intent to Abandon" No. 04-282 which set a public hearing to abandon this right-of-way.
	5. Pursuant to Streets and Highways Code §8323, Notice of this Hearing was duly published in the Telegram Tribune, a newspaper published and circulated within the City of El Paso de Robles.
	6. Pursuant to Streets and Highways Code §8323, two (2) weeks before the date set for this hearing, Notice of Vacation was posted along the line of 19 <sup>th</sup> Street.
Analysis	
and Conclusion	The request would appear to be consistent with the Streets and Highway Code and the City's General Plan. Emergency Services staff has not raised any concerns regarding the proposed abandonment.
	It is recommended that public service easements be retained within the southerly 40 feet of the right-of-way proposed to be abandoned. The City will continue maintenance of water and sewer lines in 19 <sup>th</sup> Street.



# A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PASO ROBLES VACATING A PORTION OF 19<sup>TH</sup> STREET, AN 80-FOOT RIGHT-OF-WAY WEST OF PASO ROBLES STREET (NEWTON)

- A. That pursuant to Streets and Highways Code §8322 a Notice of this Hearing has been appropriately published in a newspaper of general circulation within the City of El Paso de Robles; and
- B. That pursuant to Streets and Highways Code §8323 a Notice of Vacation has been appropriately posted along the line of the street to be vacated; and
- C. That 19<sup>th</sup> Street from Pine Street to the Union Pacific Railroad, an eighty (80) foot right of way as described in this Resolution, is unnecessary for present or prospective public use.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF EL PASO de ROBLES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Subject to the conditions set forth in Section 2 below, 19<sup>th</sup> Street, as herein before described be vacated for public purposes Exhibit "A".
- 2. That the City retains an easement for the construction, operation and maintenance of water, sanitary sewer, and other public utilities and services over and under the southerly 40 feet of the right-of-way to be abandoned, as described in Exhibit "A".
- 4. That the City Clerk of the City of El Paso de Robles is authorized to cause a certified copy of this Resolution to be recorded in the office of the County Clerk Recorder, County of San Luis Obispo, State of California.

5. The above Recitals are incorporated into this Order.
