**SUBJECT:** Modification of Standard Street Improvements – Tract 2609 (Harrod)

**DATE:** April 5, 2005

Needs: That the City Council authorize the approval of a modification to the City

Standard Details and Specifications for the construction of sidewalks on Cool

Valley Road in Tract 2609.

**Facts:** 1. Tentative Tract 2609 was approved by the Planning Commission on November 23, 2004.

2. In accordance with Condition No. 16 of Planning Commission Resolution 04-128, Cool Valley Road shall be constructed in accordance with City Local Street Standard A-5. Standard A-5 calls for a five-foot parkway between the curbs and the sidewalks.

- 3. In a letter dated January 18, 2004, received by the City 3-3-05 (see attachment 1), Mike Harrod requests that the Standard A-5 be modified in Tract 2609 in order to place the sidewalks directly adjacent to the curbs. No parkway would be provided.
- 4. As stated in Harrod's letter, Cool Valley Road east of Tract 2609 is constructed in accordance with City standards prior to the Council's policy of installing parkways on new streets. Therefore, sidewalks on Cool Valley Road east of Tract 2609 are located directly adjacent to the curbs.
- 5. It has been the Council's policy since the establishment of the Landscape and Lighting District to place landscaped parkways between curbs and sidewalks in new developments.
- 6. A modification to City Standard Street improvements may be granted by the City Council in accordance with Section 11.40.010 of the Municipal Code.

## Analysis and Conclusion

As stated in the facts, it has been Council policy for many years to require the placement of landscaped parkways with the development of new streets in new residential neighborhoods. The proposed modification to place sidewalk adjacent to curbs in Tract 2609 may provide a logical extension of Cool Valley Road if the landscaping on the individual lots meets the intentions of Harrod's request.

WHEREAS, Mr. Harrod has requested the City Council to allow the construction of sidewalks on Cool Valley Road in Tract 2609 adjacent to the curbs, thereby eliminating the landscaped parkway, and

WHEREAS, Cool Valley Road east of Tract 2609 has sidewalks directly adjacent to the curbs; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Harrod seeks to maintain the streetscape of Cool Valley Road in a manner consistent with its existing condition of Cool Valley Road east of Tract 2609, and

WHEREAS, a modification to City Standard Street improvements may be granted by the City Council in accordance with Section 11.40 of the Municipal Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED, AND ORDERED as follows:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> That the City Council of the City of El Paso de Robles does hereby approve of the modification of street standards for Cool Valley Road in Tract 2609 to eliminate the curbside parkways as proposed by Mr. Mike Harrod.

Dear Mr. Falkenstien,

I am requesting a modification to the adopted road standard to be considered by the City Council. As you know, I have gained approval of a tentative map for my property located along Meadowlark Road between Oriole Way and Beechwood Drive, and would like to use an adjoining curb/ sidewalk standard for my Cool Valley Road extension to match the existing neighborhood.

I am requesting the modification for the following reasons:

The original Meadowlark homes built along Cool Valley Road, and the Cool Valley Road streetscape represent one of the finest neighborhoods in Paso Robles. I consider it "landmark status".

I fought hard to purchase the remaining adjacent property with a clear vision to complete (extend) Cool Valley Road lengthwise as the best design alternative, and thus also being able to double one of the best Streets in town under my own "hands on" direction.
