Subject: Water User Fee Ordinance – Rate Restructuring

DATE: August 16, 2005

Needs:

Consider second reading and adoption of ordinance modifying rate structure for water user fees.

Facts:

- 1. In August 2004, the Council authorized future increases in water consumption rates to pay for Nacimiento Water.
- 2. During this discussion, questions were raised regarding how the existing rate structure was developed and whether consideration should be given to developing an alternative rate structure.
- 3. The Council appointed Mayor Pro Tem Jim Heggarty and Councilman Gary Nemeth to serve as an ad hoc committee on this matter.
- 4. A variety of options were examined. The Council's ad hoc committee is recommending "no flat rate/no minimum consumption" or "pay-as-you-go" option for Council consideration.
- 5. The proposed rate re-structuring is intended to be "revenue neutral", i.e., the City will realize no financial gain or loss.
- 6. On June 7, 2005, the Council introduced and held the first reading of the ordinance to re-structure the rates.
- 7. On June 21, 2005, the Council requested a postponement to provide additional opportunity for public input.

Analysis and Conclusion:

The City's current bi-monthly rate structure includes a flat, or fixed, rate (currently \$38.88 including 7/1/05 CPI adjustment and \$6 monthly Nacimiento Water fee) for water consumed up to and including the first 20 units consumed (a unit is748 gallons – rounding up, the bi-monthly consumption maximum allowance for the fixed/flat rate is 15,000 gallons [748 gallons x 20 units]). Should a water consumer use more than 20 units over the two month billing period each unit is billed at \$0.96.

An alternative rate structure could be developed_based upon the cost of water infrastructure, production, storage and distribution facilities, required to provide water to every user. The reasoning behind this methodology is that every customer would pay a fixed dollar amount representing the amortized cost of the basic infrastructure required to provide water at the "tap". Additionally, minimum consumption units would be eliminated. Customers would pay for all water consumed beginning with the first unit. Based upon "statistical averaging" and the assumption of "revenue neutrality" this rate option would look as follows:

```
Flat rate amount = $21.26 per billing period ($9.04 plus 2.4% plus $12.00 for Nac Water)
```

Consumption rate amount = \$0.976 per unit beginning w/1st unit

The third rate option presented to the ad hoc committee was a fully consumption based rate structure. Under this option, the flat rate charge, except for Nacimiento Water, and any minimum consumption units is eliminated. Customers would pay only for what or as they consume (much as drivers do when purchasing gasoline). Based upon "statistical averaging" and the assumption of "revenue neutrality" this rate option would look as follows:

Consumption rate amount = \$1.21 per unit beginning w/1st unit (Plus \$6.00 per month for Nac Water)

The following rate matrix illustrates the various rate alternatives including the application of the annual CPI inflation and Nacimiento water factors for a bi-monthly billing cycle:

As noted above, the Council's ad hoc committee has recommended Option #3. As clearly illustrated by the matrix, customers who consume little water would pay less and those that use more would pay more. Assuming "statistical averaging" remains constant, this option would be "revenue neutral".


Fiscal Impact:

None, since the modified rate structure is intended to be "revenue neutral". However, customer reaction to the proposed rate structure is not predictable. Thus, the City may need to bring back further refinements once customer reactions are known.


Options:

ORDINANCE NO. XXX N.S.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES AMENDING SECTIONS 14.04.020 OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES MUNICIPAL CODE TO ADJUST WATER USER FEES

WHEREAS, the City Council is desirous of modifying the current water user fee rate structure; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that a water user fee rate structure based entirely upon water consumption, except for the fixed rate previously adopted for Nacimiento Water Project, is more equitable; and

WHEREAS, the proposed changes in the water user fee rate structure are intended to be "revenue neutral".

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> Subdivision C of Section 14.04.020 of the Paso Robles Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"C. FEES—WATER USAGE RATES. The monthly rates to be charged and collected by the water department for all water consumption including private fire lines, bulk water delivery or fire hydrant usage from every person, school, firm or corporation shall be charged at rates established by ordinance of the City Council. Other than as expressly set forth herein, such water usage rates may only be established or amended by a two-thirds vote of the city council in favor of such establishment or amendment of water usage rates.

That section of Ordinance No. 882 relating to the fixed rate monthly user fee for Nacimiento Water Project shall remain in place and unchanged by this ordinance amendment. The remaining portion of the fixed rate water user fee shall be eliminated and the current variable rate shall be increased to \$1.21 per hundred cubic feet (unit) and shall apply for each hundred cubic feet (unit) of water consumed beginning with the first hundred cubic feet (unit) consumed.

The base water usage fee and variable consumption rate established in this section shall be modified annually by the increase in the Consumer Price Index for the San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose Region as reported by the Bureau of Labor Statistics for the year ending April of each year and shall be applied to all billing statements calculated, generated and distributed beginning July 1st of each fiscal year.

The water usage fees shall further be reviewed no less than bi-annually in conjunction with the update of the City's budget to ensure that water user fees then in existence do not exceed the costs of providing water service within the City."

SECTION 2. Severability

If any action, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance by section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, or phrases are declared unconstitutional.

<u>SECTION 3</u>: <u>Publication</u>. The City Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be published once within fifteen (15) days after its passage in a newspaper of general circulation, printed, published and circulated in the City in accordance with section 36933 of the Government Code.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> <u>Inconsistency.</u> To the extent that the terms of provisions of this Ordinance may be inconsistent or in conflict with the terms or conditions of any prior City ordinance(s), motion, resolution, rule, or regulation governing the same subject matter thereof and such inconsistent and conflicting provisions of prior ordinances, motions, resolutions, rules, and regulations are hereby repealed.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance shall go into effect and be in full force and effect at 12:01 a.m. on the 31st day after its passage.
