SUBJECT:	Fire Station #2, Additional Allocation March 7, 2006			
DATE:				
NEEDS:	For the City Council to consider appointing additional funds to affect a budget shortfall in the retrofit and expansion of Fire Station #2.			
FACTS:	1. Fire Station #2 was constructed in 1968.			
	2. The structure was not sized to house a full time fire crew, therefore it became necessary to rehabilitate the structure and increase its size.			
	3. Bids for the retrofit and expansion were secured in April 2005 and a contract awarded.			
	4. The total contract for the project including a 5% contingency and the required 1% contribution to Public Art was \$446,714.00.			
	5. The purpose of the contingency amount of \$20,000.00 was to offset unanticipated changes to the contract not included in the construction documents.			
	6. In the case of Fire Station #2 the following conditions were the major contributors to the additional cost (a complete list of change order items is attached):			
	a. The award of bid was delayed to allow for the adoption of the City Budget. The delay resulted in a increase in the cost of lumber.			
	b. After removing two (2) layers of existing floor covering, a third layer of flooring was discovered. The flooring consisted of 9" x 9" asbestos tile. In accordance with Environmental Health Regulations, the project had to stop until such time as the asbestos could be removed.			
	c. The existing building included a masonry wall that extended floor to ceiling separating the apparatus bay from the living quarters. The construction plans were designed to use the wall to anchor the apparatus bay against a seismic event. During the construction process it was discovered that the wall was only partially grouted. As a result the building required structural reengineering and retrofit.			
	7 Because the project was significantly underway the project could not be			

7. Because the project was significantly underway, the project could not be further redesigned or reduced in scope to cover the shortfall that resulted from the unanticipated conditions.

Analysis and	
Conclusion:	The cost of addressing the all change order conditions was \$83,000.00. The City Council provided a \$20,000.00 contingency at time of bid award to offset potential contract changes. The contingency reduced the final change order amount to \$63,000.00. In order to cover the completed cost of the project, an additional allocation of \$63,000.00 will be required to cover the cost of addressing the asbestos and unreiforced masonry issues.
POLICY REFERENCE:	Adopted Capital Improvement Program
FISCAL IMPACT:	An additional \$63,000.00 is required to supplement the budget adopted for the rehabilitation of the Sherwood Fire Station. The funding may be allocated from existing Capital Project Funds.
OPTIONS: a	Adopt Resolution No. 06-xx appropriating an additional \$63,000.00 to budget Account No. 111.910.5452.514 from existing Capital Improvement Funds.

<u>SECTION 1.</u> The City Council of the City of Paso Robles does hereby allocate \$63,000.00 from existing Capital Project Funds to Budget Account 111.910.5452.514 cover the shortfall associated with the Seismic Retrofit and Expansion of Fire Station No. 2.
