CALL MEETING TO ORDER

PUBLIC COMMENTS

2. **Guest Speaker**
 - Doug Monn, Director of Public Works has worked for the City of Paso Robles for 23 years in various departments and positions. He currently has 60 employees working for him on roads, sewers, parks, building maintenance, wastewater and water. Doug did a very thorough job of explaining his responsibilities as Director of Public Works and how it ties in with the public’s life, which was very interesting.
 - Councilman Nemeth gave Monn the 2006 Economic Strategy book to discuss due to the many questions asked by the Youth Commissioners. This led into a discussion about the growing population of Paso Robles, education, the estimated pay scale for people achieving different levels of education and the importance of working for a college degree, etc.

- Discussed two public workshops and invited the Y.C. to attend the last one to be held March 9 where they can get more information.

GOALS & AD HOC COMMUNICATION

Midnight Movies (Allison, Dahlen, Kingsbury, Slavinski and Annelise Lemons)

- Very low attendance at the 2/24 P.J. Movie held at Centennial.
- Members want to go back to Park Cinemas but to be successful they felt that we have to show a good movie and open it up to students in the SLO County – not just Paso Robles. Gorton will check with theater manager.
- Annelise will check on the 11 p.m. teen curfew for driving to the Midnight movie.

Skate Park (Cervantes, Huse, Kingsbury, Slavinski and Charlotte Gorton)

- Annie Robb has done a draft staff report to the City Manager that will go to the City Council for consideration possibly at their March 21 meeting with options of how to operate the Paso skate park.
- Charlotte attended the grand opening of the George Beatie Skate Park in Atascadero that has a concessionaire. They sell skateboards, parts and accessories and the concessionaire helps staff the skate park in addition to rec leaders.

Community Services (Allison, Aviña, Dahlen, Hartmann and Julie Dahlen)

- Adi is waiting to hear from Farmers Market for a date in April for the blood drive.
- Daniel would like to set a date for the CSF Food Drive at the April Y.C. meeting. The fundraisers will be held at Vons, Food for Less and Albertson markets.
- Monster Skate is March 25 at Pioneer Park from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. After some confusion, it was decided this event is a Youth Commission fundraiser, with the help from Vicky Jeffcoach, Recreation Coordinator, if needed, to sell food to raise money during the skateboarding event. Julie said this could be discussed in the Ad Hoc meeting following the meeting. Ceola Corella from the recreation division is also working on this project.
- Special Olympics – Ryan Allison took count of who will be attending the May 5 Leadership class to the Special Olympics in San Luis Obispo.

Battle of the Jamz (Caruana, Cervantes, Cisneros, Huse, V.Jeffcoach, C.Gorton and N.Joynt)

- The Ad Hoc Committee met Feb. 27 and the event is June 2 at the Mid-State fairgrounds on the Frontier Stage with an extra portable stage. They changed the name to “Jamz”. We also have Nancy Joynt from the recreation division working on this large project.
- Competition will include: pre-screening of bands with videos or CD’s and the deadline is April 14.
- Youth Commissioners will judge video tapes. The top 6 – 8 bands will be chosen.
- We will invite 10 – 12 dance groups from pre-screening to perform.
- Entry fee is \$10 with no smoking or moshing.
