**SUBJECT:** Diagonal parking, East side of Oak Street from 21<sup>st</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> Street.

**NEEDS:** For the City Council to consider a request to convert parking from parallel to diagonal along the east side of Oak Street from 21<sup>st</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> Street.

**FACTS:**

1. The City received a request, with plans, from EDA design professional to reconfigure the east side of Oak Street between 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> Streets to accommodate angled parking.
2. The request was reviewed by the Streets and Utilities committee at the August 25, 2006 meeting. The consensus of the committee was to recommend that City Council approve the request and expand it to include diagonal parking along the east side of Oak Street through the 2200 block.

**ANALYSIS &**

**CONCLUSION:** In conjunction with a project to remodel an existing Grocery Market at the 2100 block of Spring Street a suggestion was made to also convert the east side of Oak Street between 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> from parallel to angled parking. The street width at that location is sufficient to accommodate angled parking and no negative impacts were identified.

**FISCAL**

**IMPACT:** Cost will be paid by developer for the 2100 block. The installation of 20 diagonal spaces along the 2200 blocks of Oak will cost approximately \$600. Installation will be paid from the approved FY06/07 maintenance budget.

**OPTIONS:**

- a. Approve the request to convert parking from parallel to diagonal on the east side of Oak Street from 21<sup>st</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> Streets.
- b. Amend, modify or reject above option.
