DATE:	March 6, 2007
NEEDS:	For the City Council to confirm top goals for Fiscal Years 2008-2011.
FACTS:	1. Every two years, the City Council adopts goals, as well as a two-year budget and four-year financial plan.
	<ol> <li>A new 2-year budget/4-year financial plan is under development for the 2008- 2011 fiscal years.</li> </ol>
	3. The budget & financial plan will be oriented around the City Councils' goals.
	4. The Council compiled candidate goals against objectives of the Economic Strategy (Exhibit A).
	5. The candidate goals were ranked in Council vote/point order (Exhibit B).
	6. The City Council may modify or confirm their goals for inclusion in the new 2- year budget and 4-year financial plan.
ANALYSIS & CONCLUSION:	The City Council developed and considered a list of 84 candidate goals on February 15, 2005. Goal development was the result of individual Councilmember suggestions, previously adopted goals, and extensive public input.

Each Council Member was allotted 75 points to be cast in amounts between 0-5 on individual candidate goals; 5 being the highest. The highest score any individual goal could receive was 25 (e.g., 5 Council Members each allocating 5 points). The total points available for all goals were 375 (e.g., 75 points for each of 5 Council Members).

The point ranking process appears straightforward; however, point awards may be skewed by consideration of previously adopted goals. Specifically, some Council Members may have chosen to limit point awards for previously adopted goals on the premise that the previously adopted goals are still valid and will be completed even if no points are awarded (in the 2007 goal setting). Alternatively, some Council Members may have chosen to underscore the importance of previously adopted goals by awarding points thereto.

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The candidate goals fit within the four components of the Economic Strategy (Exhibit A):

- <u>People</u> increase the educational attainment and skills of, opportunities, and demand for local labor.
- <u>Place</u> establish distinctive, quality, stable, safe and sustainable physical improvements and attractions.
- <u>Positioning</u> promote the distinctive character, heritage and attributes of Paso Robles as a destination to visit, shop, invest, work and live.
- <u>Partnership</u> collaborate to foster economic growth and improve quality of life.

From the Council's voting:

- 78% (or 292) out of 375 total possible points were cast for goals that promote the establishment of distinctive, quality, stable, safe and sustainable physical improvements and attractions (<u>Place</u>).
- 74 of 84 candidate goals received votes/points. This represents a broad and diverse spectrum of interest, which is further evidenced by:
  - Only 2 goals received more than half of the maximum 25 available to any one goal.
  - Only 4 goals received support from all 5 Council Members.
  - Only 6 more received support from 4 Council Members.
  - 3 of the top 11 goals received support from just 3 Council Members.
  - Just 16 goals received a score of "4" or "5" from any Council Member, and
    - only 5 of the 16 received a "4" or "5" from 2 or more Council Members, and
    - only 6 of the 16 were among the top 11 points getters.

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Clearly, there appears to be a broad and diverse agenda for the future. This provides for the pursuit of many objectives and opportunities, and will do so for a time considerably longer than can be addressed in the upcoming 2/4year budget/financial plan. At the same time, concentration of the near-term allocation of time, energy and resources will require focus.

*NOTE:* Exhibit A, the listing of all candidate goals in Economic Strategy format, will be retained, regardless of 2007 goal selection, as the evolving community-defined action plan to implement the Economic Strategy.
