3. Senior Scholarship Update

- Lynda advised Friendly Rides for Seniors is averaging five rides from the Senior Center per week.
- With help from her Cuesta College volunteers, Lynda now has a Transportation Services for Senior Citizens booklet. Inside has all the pertinent transportation information.

6. **Senior Endowment Fund**

- Annie Robb, Director, handed out a graph showing the financial history and discussed
 the original agreement of the Senior Endowment Fund. The Director voiced her
 concern about the dwindling Fund and the need to find a resource to replenish this
 Fund.
- Discussed various methods of raising money, bequest planning, financial and estate planning, etc.

- Lynda discussed recruitments done on June 8 to fill the vacancy from Cindy Duff. Hopefully this position will be filled by July.
- Lynda showed everyone the Adopt-A-Street bags and flyers available for everyone to take.

<u>Charlotte Gorton, Recreation Services Manager:</u>

- The Summer Concert Series in the City Park runs from 6/22 8/24. Recreation staff and REC Foundation Committee are working together to upgrade the music and event offered to public. REC Foundation also sponsors the Shakespeare Under the Moon outdoor play.
- The Municipal indoor aquatic pool is closed for renovation and awaiting PG&E to do the underground electrical. The outdoor pools are now open week-ends and both pools will be open for the 2007 summer season and swim lessons on June 18.
- We have had numerous job recruitments and interviews recently in the recreation division.

Ann Robb, Director:

• Director discussed the City Council passed the 2008-2011 Budget.

• Gruner asked the Director if she would discuss the Senior Citizen portion of the budget at the July meeting.

Fred Strong, City Council:
