SUBJECT: South Vine Street – Funding Supplement

DATE: February 17, 2009

NEEDS: For the City Council to consider supplementing the budget for the Vine Street project.

FACTS: 1. On December 16, 2008, City Council adopted a budget of \$2,741,886 for the South Vine under Budget No. 111.910.5452.540. The project boundaries are from First Street to Wilmar Place (see attached).

- 2. Additionally, at the December 16, 2008 Council meeting, Council directed staff to evaluate the possibility of extending the project further south to the Caltrans Right-of-Way. It is estimated that this extension would cost \$400,000.
- 3. Approximately a week after adoption of the project budget, the State notified the City that one of the grants (Proposition 1B) would be placed on hold as a result of the State budget crisis. The amount of this grant is \$438,765.
- 4. As a result of the increased scope of work and the grant being placed on hold, the City will need to allocate an additional \$840,000 in supplemental funding in order to complete the project.

ANALYSIS & CONCLUSION:

There is currently a fund balance of \$950,000 in Fund 200 (Gas Tax). City Council could consider appropriating additional funds to the South Vine project as follows:

- \$440,000 to backfill the Prop 1B second phase grant that the State has put on hold. (Note: Should the State release this grant before the project is complete, the money from Fund 200 would not be needed and would therefore remain in Fund 200.)
- \$400,000 to extend the project to the Caltrans Right-of-Way

Fund 200 (Gas Tax) is normally allocated to City street maintenance. When the State releases the Prop 1B funding (\$438,765), an equal amount can be appropriated for other street maintenance.

Project (Budget No. 111.910.5452.540) from Fund 200 – Gas Tax.


OPTIONS: a. Adopt Resolution No. 09-xx appropriating \$840,000 to the Vine Street project from Fund 200 to:

RESOLUTION NO. 09-

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PASO ROBLES SUPPLEMENTING THE BUDGET FOR THE SOUTH VINE STREET PROJECT

WHEREAS, on December 16, 2008, City Council adopted a budget of \$2,741,886 for the South Vine project under Budget No. 111.910.5452; and

WHEREAS, the project boundaries are from First Street to Wilmar Place; and

WHEREAS, in late December 2008, the State notified the City that the Proposition 1B grant in the amount of \$438,765 is being placed on hold due to the State budget crisis; and

WHEREAS, on December 16, 2008, City Council directed staff to evaluate the possibility of extending the project further south, to the Caltrans Right-of-Way; and

WHEREAS, the cost to extend the project south to the Caltrans Right-of-Way is estimated to cost \$400,000; and

WHEREAS, staff has requested that Council consider appropriating additional funds to the South Vine project as follows: \$440,000 to backfill the Proposition 1B second phase grant that the State has put on hold, and \$400,000 to extend the project to the Caltrans Right-of-Way; and

WHEREAS, there is currently a fund balance of \$950,000 in Fund 200–Gas Tax.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City Council of the City of Paso Robles does hereby appropriate \$840,000 to the Vine Street project (Account No.111.910.5452) from Fund 200–Gas Tax as follows: \$440,000 to backfill the Proposition 1B second phase grant that the State has put on hold, and \$400,000 to extend the project to the Caltrans Right-of-Way
