SUBJECT: Code Amendment 09-002: Employee Housing

DATE: May 19, 2009

Needs: To consider a City-initiated amendment to the Zoning Code to establish regulations pertaining to

employee housing as a means of addressing the city need for housing for seasonal farmworkers,

as identified in the Housing Element.

Facts:

1. A public hearing on the referenced code amendment has been noticed for the City Council's meeting of May 19, 2009. A copy of that notice is attached.

2. The Planning Commission is scheduled to conduct a public hearing on this code amendment on May 12, 2009.

3. For many years, the City often scheduled code amendments for "back-to-back" hearings before the Planning Commission and City Council, and in doing so, commonly used a single newspaper advertisement, such as the attached, to give notice for both hearings.

- 4. The California Appellant Court recently ruled that, for matters such as code amendments, which require that the City Council take action following a recommendation by the Planning Commission, public notice of the City Council meeting may not be published until after the Planning Commission has made its recommendation.
- 5. To comply with the court decision, the hearing on this code amendment must be republished.

Analysis and Conclusion:

The next available Council meeting date for which proper notice may be given is June 16.

Options: Upon receipt of public comments, take one of the following actions:

a. Continue the public hearing for the project to June 16, 2009.

b. Amend, modify, or reject the foregoing option.
