SUBJECT: Statewide Park Development and Community Revitalization Grant - First Five

Property at 641 36th Street

DATE: February 16, 2010

Needs: For the City Council to consider approving an application for statewide park program grant funds

Facts:

- 1. Competitive grant funds are available for construction of new parks and recreation opportunities in proximity to the most critically underserved communities across California. The City is an eligible applicant. Grants may be made up to \$5 million. Grant applications are due March 1, 2010.
- 2. The County Office of Education is building a First 5 School Readiness facility at 641 36th Street. The temporary re-locatable buildings will include two preschool classrooms and an office. The site will also be the new location of the City Library Study Center. City and COE staff propose that the 2 acres of open space on the parcel be developed as a city park. If awarded, grant funds could pay for the construction of the park. There is no match required.
- 3. Through recent community meetings, community members identified desirable park components. Because it is adjacent to preschools and Georgia Brown School, an outdoor exploration/learning component was favored. Additionally, residents felt strongly about a family and senior friendly park that would generate neighborhood pride. The proposed park consists of nature play and exploration areas, trails, an amphitheater, and picnic area. The cost estimate of the park is under \$3 million.
- 4. A lease agreement would allow the City to lease the property from COE. Under the lease, the City would construct the park on COE property with grant funds. Upon completion of park construction, an operating agreement would define the areas of responsibility for park administration. The operating agreement will be presented to City Council for final approval at a later date.

Analysis and Conclusion:

An opportunity exists to apply for grant funds to construct a new park on the site of the County Office of Education First 5 Family Center. No match is required. An operating agreement will identify responsibilities in administering the park.

 - 3. Authorize the Mayor to sign a Letter of Intent to enter into a ground lease and operating agreement upon the California Department of Parks and Recreation providing notice that it is irrevocably committed to providing City with grant funds, under its Statewide Park Development and Community Revitalization Program of 2008 in an amount sufficient to fully construct the "Park" (as defined in the Ground Lease)
 - b. Amend, modify, or reject above options.
