SUBJECT: 2010 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program

DATE: July 20, 2010

Needs:

For the City Council to make budget appropriations for projects to be accomplished with the City's allotment of 2009 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds and with re-programmed funds from prior years.

Facts:

1. At its meeting of March 4, 2010, the City Council adopted Resolution 10-028 determining that the following activities are to be funded with the City's 2010 allotment of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds (which were estimated to be \$277,207) and with \$52,000 in re-programmed funds from the First 5 Demolition Project:

2. Since adoption of Resolution 10-028, the City has been notified that it's allotment of 2010 CDBG funds was to be \$300,090, or \$22,883 more than estimated. Consequently, the City Manager approved an administrative allocation of the

additional \$22,883 so as to result in the schedule below. In this schedule: the public service grants were increased proportionately so that their collective amounts totaled 15% of the new total; Capacity Building and Administration were likewise increased so that their combined amounts totaled 20% of the new total; and the remainder (\$14,450) was allocated to the Riverside Sidewalks project.

- 3. It is important to note that the administrative re-allocation described above is consistent with federal regulations that limit the amount of CDBG funds that can be awarded to public services to 15% of the Program Year 2010 allocation.
- 4. During the past year, the 2007 CDBG-funded handicapped ramps project was completed leaving \$1,745.65 unspent. Therefore, the City Manager administratively transferred that amount to the 36th Street Improvements Project. These funds should be re-appropriated.
- 5. The City expects to soon be notified that the US Department of Housing and Urban Development has approved the County of San Luis Obispo's 2010 One Year Action Plan, which includes the City's proposal for use of 2010 CDBG funds.
- 6. The City has already budgeted the amount allocated to Administration and Capacity Building (administrative activities), but needs to make appropriations for the non-administrative projects.

Analysis and Conclusion:

The attached resolution appropriates the 2010 CDBG funds and re-programmed CDBG funds from prior program years to the projects listed above.

Policy Reference:

Federal regulations for the Community Development Block Grant Program

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Impact: Participation in the federal CDBG Program has involved and will continue to demand a

commitment of staff resources. Utilizing CDBG funds for the allowable administrative

expenses avoids adverse impacts on the City's General Fund.

Options:

a. Adopt Resolution 10-XXX to allocate the City's allotment of 2010 CDBG funds and

re-programmed 2007 CDBG funds.

b. Amend, modify or reject the foregoing option.
