8. Ordinance to Amend Fiscal Year 10/11 Budget to Appropriate Redevelopment Low and Moderate Income Housing Funds for the Hidden Creek Village affordable housing project.

For the City Council to adopt an ordinance to amend the Fiscal Year 10/11 Budget to appropriate Redevelopment Low and Moderate Income Housing (LMIH) Funds for the Hidden Creek Village affordable housing project.
