PROCLAMATION

2011 A Year of Celebration of the 100th Anniversary of California Women Having the Right to Vote in the City of Paso Robles

WHEREAS, in 1911 Proposition 4 (Constitutional Amendment #8) was placed on the October 10, 1911 special election ballot giving California women the right to vote; and

WHEREAS, California women campaigned across the state, stopping in rural counties and cities gaining support from local women and men as a main part of their strategy; and

WHEREAS, the hard work of strong local suffragists and their male supporters garnered enough YES votes to pass Proposition 4; and

WHEREAS, the cities of San Luis Obispo County collectively and proudly cast YES votes by a 12% margin to counteract the NO votes of their counterparts in some large cities; and

WHEREAS, the San Luis Obispo County vote helped California become the sixth state to give women the right to vote; and

WHEREAS, 2011 marks the 100th anniversary of California women having the right to vote; and

WHEREAS, women's rights states like California were instrumental in getting the 19th amendment passed nationally in 1920.

Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that I, Duane Picanco, Mayor of the City of Paso Robles, speaking on behalf of the entire City Council and the Citizens of Paso Robles, hereby proclaim 2011 as a year of celebration of the "100 Year Anniversary of California Women's Right To Vote".

In witness whereof, on the 15th day of March 2011, I have herunto set my hand and caused the seal of the City of Paso Robles to be affixed.
