#### DISCUSSION

#### Uptown/Town Centre Specific Plan, General Plan Amendment 2011-001, and Code Amendment 11-001

For the City Council to consider approval of the Uptown/Town Centre Specific Plan, General Plan Amendment 2011-001, Code Amendment 11-001, and certification of the Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for these actions.

Ron Whisenand gave an introduction to the item and suggested public comment should be received. Ed Gallagher noted typos on pages 41, 43, & 83 of the staff report.

## 8. Repair of Light Conduits on Veterans Memorial Bridge (aka Niblick Bridge) D. Monn, Public Works Director

# 9. Charolais Corridor Multi-Use Trail & Restoration Project – Natural Resources Agency Environmental Enhancement Mitigation Program Grant (EEMP)

For City Council to consider accepting an EEMP grant in the amount of \$350,000, allocating matching funds for the grant, and authorizing an agreement with the State of California for development of a trail between River Road and the Salinas River along the unimproved westerly extension of Charolais right-of-way.
