NEEDS: For City Council to consider awarding a contract to improve curb ramps and sidewalks

at and adjacent to the Intersections of 36th and Oak Streets, 34th and Oak Streets, and

Spring and 26th Streets (DPW 10-16).

FACTS:

1. City Council has previously approved the use of federal Community Development

Block Grant (CDBG) Funds to install curbs, gutters, sidewalks, and handicapped ramps in 36th Street, adjacent to the First 5 School Readiness/Family Resource Center and at other nearby intersections where LED Crosswalks are proposed (34th and Oak Street, 26th and Spring Streets), and where ADA accessibility

improvements are needed in proximity of the First 5 School.

2. To achieve economies of scale and secure more prospective bidders, several of the previously approved CDBG-funded projects were combined into this single project bid.

3. Bid documents were prepared and the project was advertised for bids.

4. At the bid opening on May 26, 2011, the City received five bids:
