SUBJECT: 2011 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program

DATE: September 20, 2011

Needs:

For the City Council to make budget appropriations for projects to be accomplished with the City's allotment of 2011 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds and with reprogrammed funds from prior years.

Facts:

1. At its meeting of March 3, 2011, the City Council adopted Resolution 11-026 determining that the following activities are to be funded with the City's 2011 allotment of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds and program income (which collectively were estimated to be \$308,190) and with \$50,000 in re-programmed 2009 funds from the Riverside Avenue Sidewalks Project:

2. Since adoption of Resolution 11-026, the City has been notified that it's allotment of 2011 CDBG funds was to be \$250,240, or \$49,850 less than estimated. Consequently, the City Manager approved an administrative allocation of the additional \$49,850 so as to result in the schedule on the following page.

- 3. It is important to note that the administrative re-allocation described above is consistent with federal regulations that limit the amount of CDBG funds that can be awarded to public services to 15% of the Program Year 2010 allocation.
- 4. During the past year, the 2010 CDBG-funded Riverside Avenue Sidewalks project was completed leaving a little more than \$50,000 unspent. Therefore, the City Manager administratively transferred \$25,000 of that amount to the following projects. These funds should be re-appropriated.
 - a. \$10,000 to the LED-Lighted Crosswalk at Spring and 26th Streets;
 - b. \$15,000 to the LED-Lighted Crosswalk at Oak and 34th Streets.
- 5. The City was recently notified that the US Department of Housing and Urban Development has approved the County of San Luis Obispo's 2011 One Year Action Plan, which includes the City's proposal for use of 2011 CDBG funds.
- The City has already budgeted the amount allocated to Administration and Capacity Building (administrative activities), but needs to make appropriations for the nonadministrative projects.

Analysis and

Conclusion:

The attached resolution appropriates the 2011 CDBG funds and re-programmed CDBG funds from prior program years to the projects listed above.

Impact:

Participation in the federal CDBG Program has involved and will continue to demand a commitment of staff resources. Utilizing CDBG funds for the allowable administrative expenses avoids adverse impacts on the City's General Fund.
