# Dear Councilmembers,

On behalf of the California Grocers Association, I am encouraging the City of Paso Robles to accept the policy direction provided by the Integrated Waste Management Authority, which bans plastic bags and places a retailer retained charge on paper bags. A unified regional approach to carryout bag regulations provides retailers regulatory consistency and eliminates jurisdictional disadvantages. A countywide ordinance approach also creates greater predictability for consumers and provides the greatest amount of environmental gain.

CGA is a non-profit, statewide trade association representing the food industry since 1898. CGA represents approximately 500 retail members operating over 6,000 food stores in California and Nevada, and approximately 300 grocery supplier companies. Retail membership includes chain and independent supermarkets, convenience stores and mass merchandisers. CGA members operate a number of grocery stores located in Paso Robles and in San Luis Obispo County.
