1. It was moved and seconded by Peters/Janes, to approve the Minutes of the July 11, 2011 meeting - motion carried.

2. <u>Senior Endowment Report</u>

The July and August Senior Endowment report was received and filed.

BUSINESS ITEMS:

2. Paula O'Farrell, President of Parks 4 Pups, described the group's proposal to build a temporary dog park on land due east of the Senior Center. LRS Director Julie Dahlen gave a summary of the Sherwood Park Master Plan which calls for tennis courts on this property. Dahlen also explained that the Senior Advisory Committee was approached as a stakeholder in this matter rather than an advisor to City Council since the proposed dog park would be adjacent to the Senior Center.

Ten guests spoke in support of allowing a temporary dog park on the site.

Concerns regarding dog park visitors using the Senior Center dog park were dissuaded by O'Farrell who contends that peak dog-park usage occurs when the Senior Center is closed. Consensus of Senior Advisory members is that the dog park is a complementary amenity to the Senior Center.

4. Review 2011-2012 Goals

Promote Senior Activities – Watson reported that the Senior Citizen Advisory PowerPoint presentation is ready for use in promoting the Senior Center. In the next six months committee members will present it to community groups. Peters suggested she would like to show it at a Kiwanis meeting.

Promote Volunteerism – Brinkmeyer said Trine Marlen offered to house a RSVP representative one afternoon per week at the Senior Center. Recreation Manager, Lynda Holt will follow up on this proposal.

Fundraising – Bybee presented an idea to have a rummage sale on Saturday, Nov. 12 at the Veterans Center. The proposed schedule for the week of the rummage sale is: (Mon – Wed) Accepting donation collections (good condition)

Thurs. (Pre-Sale to Senior Center Members)

Fri. (Closed for Holiday)

Sat. (Rummage Sale) 7a – 12p

Peters noted that AMVET will pick up all unsold items.

Recreation Manager Holt will review this fundraising proposal for possible approval.

Watson asked for a volunteer in evaluating the past Black Tie Bingo event and analyzing fundraising for cost, competition, location, pricing and the availability of major sponsors. She recommends a profit level at least 20%. Martha Durrett and Pamela Janes will work on evaluation and have it available for the October meeting.
