BUSINESS ITEMS

1. Advocacy Activities/Opportunities

Since the last Advisory meeting:

- Keene-Grilli attended *Broadway Goes Country* and thought it was enjoyable.
- Shumate attended Kidz Ride Paso and the Heritage Fun Run and thought both were great community events.
- Feducia gave his opinion on the plastic bags issue that was on the agenda at a previous City Council meeting he attended.
- Taranto attended a City Council meeting at which the new water project was discussed and asked other advisory members to review the online water plant presentation.
- Barbara Partridge (former LRS Director) told advisory members that they are an extension of Library and Recreation Services and the City Council. She emphasized that they are ambassadors and carriers of the message for Council and staff.

2. SLO County Bicycle Coalition

Dan Rivoire, Executive Director of SLO County Bike Coalition, spoke on recognizing Paso Robles as a bike friendly community. San Luis Obispo is currently the only local area designated as bike friendly.

The application process in receiving bike friendly recognition, involves meeting the criteria of the League of American Bicyclist, which includes the 5 E's.

- 1. Engineering (lanes, paths)
- 2. Education (availability of education for cyclist and motorist)
- 3. Encouragement (Does community encourage biking)
- 4. Enforcement (Is law enforcement community aware of bicyclist laws)
- 5. Evaluation and Planning (Does city government have a bike plan)

Steve Fleury of the REC Foundation is currently working on the application process.

The SLO Co. Bike Coalition promotes biking and walking, and advocates bike trails and bike lanes. The SLO Co. Bike Coalition also educates and encourage through empowerment with community programs such as:

- SLO Bike Ed (Teaches rules of the road)
- SLO Bike Kitchen (Teaches bicycle maintenance)
- SLO Bike Valet (Free Bike parking at events) incentive for people to ride to an event
- Kidical Mass (Family friendly bike ride)
- 3. City Park Restroom Design- presented by Doug Monn and Freda Berman (City Staff) The City's response to a long-term need and ADA compliance is to replace the existing restrooms in Downtown City Park. The user-friendly design will be located in the same spot, but closer to the sidewalk for multi-functioning reasons. The design will be complimentary but not identical to the Carnegie Library. The Advisory members were shown three exterior elevation schemes. All Park and Recreation Advisory members agreed on the Scheme 'E' design.

CITY COMMUNICATION/REPORTS

Julie Dahlen-

- The City is exploring options for private groups to operate Centennial Pool. City Council authorized Request for Proposal submissions, which closes November 30.
- Temporary Dog Park issue went before Senior Advisory Committee one more time regarding impact on Senior Center Restrooms. There were no concerns with restroom. Members felt the Dog Park would help show off the Senior Facility.
- Reviewing 15 applications for a designer of Uptown Family Park. A \$2.5 million grant was awarded to the City of Paso Robles to design and build a family park across from Georgia Brown School. Dahlen, Berman, and Taranto are on the review committee.

UNSCHEDULED MATTERS - none

Facilitating volunteerism – Taranto said we need to move forward in the process of identifying user groups that want to volunteer. Dahlen mentioned that the REC Foundation serves recreational needs in the community. She thinks it would be good if Park & Recreation Advisory members attend Rec Foundation meetings and vice-versa. Keene-Grilli and Shumate would like to help with REC Foundation projects. Moos commented that Boy Scout Troop 60 has a total of 80 scouts looking for projects. The Eagle Scouts, ages 15-17 raise their own money to do projects with adult supervision.
