PROCLAMATION

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS, home should be a place of warmth, unconditional love, tranquility, and security, and for most of us, home and family can indeed be counted among our greatest blessings. Tragically, for many Americans, these are blessings that are tarnished by violence and fear; and

WHEREAS, the crime of domestic violence violates an individual's privacy and dignity, security and humanity, due to systematic use of physical, emotional, sexual, psychological and economic control and/or abuse including abuse to children and the elderly; and

WHEREAS, the problems of domestic violence are not confined to any group or groups of people, but cut across all economic, racial and societal barriers, and are supported by societal indifferences; and

WHEREAS, domestic violence continues to be a major, national, public health problem, affecting nearly 4 million victims each year among U.S. women ages 18 and older, with an estimated 3.3 million children witnessing domestic violence in their homes each year; and

WHEREAS, the North County Women's Shelter & Resource Center celebrating its 30th year continues to provide a safe environment with services to women, men and children who are affected by domestic violence, provides those in crisis with information, referrals, and counseling, and provides education targeted at domestic violence prevention in the wider community of San Luis Obispo County. We must recognize the compassion and dedication of these volunteers and professionals, applaud their efforts and increase public understanding of this important problem; and

WHEREAS, survivors of domestic violence themselves have been at the forefront of efforts to bring peace and equality to the home.

NOW THEREFORE, **BE IT RESOLVED** that I, Duane Picanco, Mayor of the City of El Paso de Robles, speaking on behalf of the entire City Council and the Citizens of Paso Robles, in recognition of the important work done by domestic violence programs, do hereby proclaim the month of October to be National Domestic Violence Awareness Month and urge all citizens to actively participate in the scheduled activities and programs to work toward improving victim safety and holding perpetrators of domestic abuse accountable for their actions against individual victims and our society as a whole.
