SUBJECT: Surplus Property

Needs: For the City Council to consider declaring certain City property as surplus and authorize its disposal.

Facts:

1. City equipment, from time to time, is declared surplus due to age, cost of maintenance and/or obsolescence.
2. The property listed in Exhibit A is no longer serviceable or needed for City operations.
3. Disposal of said equipment cannot take place until formally declared surplus by the Council.
4. Proceeds from the sale of the surplus equipment will be deposited back into the General Fund, Equipment Replacement Fund, or the appropriate Enterprise Fund.

Analysis & Conclusion:

The equipment identified in the attached exhibit is no longer being used by the City. The equipment will be sold by public auction, bid or sale, whichever method is for the least cost or the greatest benefit to the City.

Fiscal Impact:

Sale proceeds will be deposited back into the appropriate fund(s).

Options:

- a. Adopt Resolution No. 13-xxx declaring certain City property as surplus and authorize their sale to recyclers, wholesalers or by public auction, bid or sale; or
- b. Amend, modify, or reject the above option.

RESOLUTION NO. 13-xxx

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES
DECLARING CERTAIN CITY PROPERTY AS SURPLUS

WHEREAS, the City no longer has a need or use for the equipment listed on Exhibit A due to age, obsolescence and/or cost of maintenance; and

WHEREAS, it is highly desirable to sell or dispose of the surplus equipment for the highest return possible;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of El Paso de Robles that the City property identified in the attached Exhibit A, which is incorporated herein by reference, is declared surplus and is to be sold by public auction, bid or sale at the least cost or greatest benefit to the City, as determined by the Director of Administrative Services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of El Paso de Robles that the Director of Administrative Services is authorized to undertake any and all actions to transfer title to the successful bidder/purchaser or donee.

 - b. VIN – 1FDLE40FOVHB81853
 - c. Year - 1997
 - d. Mileage – 217,000
 - e. Reason for surplusing – Bus is long past its expected useful life, and was temporarily added to the transit fleet while new buses were ordered. The arrival of the new buses allow for the replacement of this bus.

2. Transit Bus #13 (#)
 - a. Make/Model – Ford E450/EI Dorado
 - b. VIN – 1FDWE45F12HA61289
 - c. Year - 2002
 - d. Mileage – 218,000
 - e. Reason for surplusing – Bus has exceeding its expected seven-year useful life. New buses purchased through state grant allow for the replacement of this bus.

3. Transit Bus #14 (#)
 - a. Make/Model – Ford E450/EI Dorado
 - b. VIN – 1FDWE45F82HA61290
 - c. Year - 2002
 - d. Mileage – 220,000
 - e. Reason for surplusing – Bus has exceeding its expected seven-year useful life. New buses purchased through state grant allow for the replacement of this bus.

 - c. Year - 2006
 - d. Mileage – 172,000
