9. Request To Remove Five Oak Trees At 3328 Spring Street (OTR 13-005 - Uptown Center)

For the City Council to consider a request by Rick Jeffrey to remove five oak trees in relation to the Uptown Center project.

Mayor Picanco opened the public discussion. Speaking from the public were:

10. Request To Remove Two Oak Trees At 532 2nd Street (OTR 13-006 - Nino)

For the City Council to consider a request by Steve Nino, to remove two oak trees in conjunction with the development of a vacant lot.

replacement trees to be planted at the direction of the Arborist, or payments made to the City's oak tree replacement fund.

11. Paso Robles Uptown Family Park

A motion was made by Councilman Martin and seconded by Councilman Strong to adopt Resolution 13-111 authorizing \$2,252,933.74 from funds awarded through the Proposition 84 Statewide Park Development and Community Revitalization Grant and to authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract with Newton Construction & Management, Inc. in the amount of \$2,038,121.74.

13. General Obligation Bond Tax Rate - Fiscal Year 2014

For the City Council to set the ad valorem tax rate for general obligation bond debt service for fiscal year 2014.

- Councilman Strong noted the eligibility constraints of certain grants and encouraged pursuing complimentary grants to cover areas of concern.
