NEEDS: For the City Council to designate voting delegates and alternates for the September

2014 League of Cities Annual Conference.

FACTS:

1. The League's Annual Conference is scheduled for September 3 – 5 in Los Angeles. At this meeting, the League membership considers and takes action on resolutions that establish League policy.

- 2. In order to vote at the Annual Business Meeting, the City Council must designate a voting delegate.
- 3. Two alternate voting delegates may also be appointed, who may vote in the event that the designated voting delegate is unable to serve in that capacity.

ANALYSIS &

CONCLUSION: Consistent with League bylaws, a city's voting delegate and up to two alternates

must be designated by the City Council. In order to cast a vote, delegates must be

present at least for Friday, September 3rd at the Conference.

POLICY

FISCAL

IMPACT: No fiscal impact is anticipated with establishing a voting delegate. The City

Council has an annual travel & education budget of approximately \$6,000. The number of Council attendees choosing to attend the annual conference will

determine travel & education costs.

Alternates for the 2014 League of California Cities Annual Business Conference;

or

b) Amend, modify, or reject the above options.
