Domestic Violence Awareness Month

WHEREAS, domestic violence continues to be a major, national, public health problem, affecting one in three women, with an estimated ten million children witnessing domestic violence in their homes each year; and

WHEREAS, ninety-two percent of women surveyed listed reducing domestic violence and sexual assault as their top concern; and

WHEREAS, RISE continues to provide a safe environment to those affected by domestic violence with crisis intervention, counseling, education, legal services, and emergency safe housing, with the help of dedicated volunteers and professionals; and

WHEREAS, RISE has provided services to more than seven hundred domestic violence clients in the last year, including more than five thousand collective nights provided for shelter clients, and more than sixteen thousand meals; and

WHEREAS, the City of Paso Robles strongly supports the efforts of RISE, how every segment of our society can work together to better address intimate partner violence, and how to help survivors connect with services; and

Now, Therefore, Be It resolved that I, Steve Martin, Mayor of the City of El Paso de Robles, speaking on behalf of the entire City Council and the Citizens of Paso Robles, in recognition of the important work done by domestic violence programs, do hereby proclaim the month of October to be National Domestic Violence Awareness Month.
