AYES: Strong, Gregory, Hamon, Reed, and Martin **ABSTAIN:** Councilman Hamon abstained on Consent Agenda item 5, Warrant number 39146, due to a potential conflict of interest.

REPORT ON ITEMS APPROVED ON CONSENT. City Manager Tom Frutchey provided a summary of items approved on the consent agenda.

10. Approved Certificate of Historic Appropriateness (COA 17-001) for 1949 Oak Street – Single-Family House

Councilman Reed recused himself due to a potential conflict of interest and stepped out of the room at 7:22pm

PUBLIC COMMENT. Dale Gustin

ROLL CALL VOTE. Motioned by Councilman Gregory, seconded by Councilman Strong, and passed 4-0 (with Councilman Reed abstaining) to approve of Resolution No. 17-134, approving Certificate of Appropriateness (COA 17-001).

AYES: Gregory, Strong, Hamon and Martin **ABSTAIN:** Reed

Councilman Reed returned to his seat at 7:28pm after the vote was complete.

11. <u>Approved Oak Tree Removal Permit 17-018 – Request by Mark Stephenson (Property Owner/Applicant) to</u> <u>Remove One Live Oak Tree at 1316 Chestnut Street</u>

PUBLIC COMMENT. Chip Tamagni

ROLL CALL VOTE. Motioned by Councilman Hamon, seconded by Councilman Gregory, and passed unanimously to approve Resolution No. 17-135 finding the tree is in poor condition and will likely cause damage to the property if it were to remain, and approved the removal of the tree and required payment to the oak tree replacement fund for four replacement trees to mitigate the tree removal.

12. <u>Approved Resolution No. 17-136 Confirming the Costs Associated with the Abatement of a Public</u> <u>Nuisance Relating to Weed Abatement within the City</u>

PUBLIC COMMENT. Dale Gustin and Kathy Barnett

ROLL CALL VOTE. Motioned by Councilman Gregory, seconded by Councilman Strong, and passed unanimously to approve Resolution No. 17-136 confirming the costs incurred to abate the nuisance found in Exhibit B (\$1,242.81), and initiate the proceedings to have such costs assessed against the real property at 1615 Riverside Avenue if the statement is not paid within 15 days of receipt.

13. <u>Proposed Adoption of Street Maintenance and Repair Expenditure Plan Using Supplemental Sales Tax,</u> <u>Gas Tax, and SB 1 Funds</u>

ROLL CALL VOTE. Motioned by Councilman Strong, seconded by Councilman Gregory, and passed unanimously to approve Resolution No. 17-137 Approving the Street Maintenance and Repair Expenditure Plan from FY 2018-2019 to FY 2024-2025, with an Ad Hoc representative from the City Council, an Ad Hoc representative from the Supplemental Tax Oversight Committee, and staff to meet each year prior to the budget cycle to identify roads that aren't on the Plan but that should be repaired with the un-programmed funds, and that the Council would review the Plan and those additional streets as part of the two-year budget cycle.

Motioned by Councilman Martin, seconded by Councilman Hamon, and passed 4 -1 (Councilman Gregory dissenting) to direct the City Manager and City Attorney to prepare a ballot measure for the November 2018 General Election asking voters to consider increasing Councilmember and Mayoral salaries by 60% over current salaries.
