Subject: Council Goal-Setting Workshop Focus, Format, and Schedule

Date: December 19, 2017

### **Facts**

1. The City's two-year budget development process will start early in the new year.

- 2. City Councils frequently hold a goal-setting session at the beginning of the budget process. These can take many different forms.
- 3. The Council's last goal-setting session was in April, 2015. This session focused on primarily operational-level goals (see Attachment 1 for results).
- 4. There are a number of strategic-level issues currently facing the City, with long-term impact, including, among others: housing shortages; head-of-household job shortages; economic development in the face of Diablo Canyon's closure; maximizing the future of the airport; increasing the quantity and quality of community engagement; etc.
- 5. Many of these go right to the heart of the Council's vision and the community's vision for the future of Paso Robles and the north County. This meta-level vision has not been re-examined in a systematic way in many years.
- 6. The recent community survey (reported elsewhere in this agenda) generated results that indicate there are significant opportunities for positive impact and influence of our future.
- 7. The Council could take this opportunity to step back and re-assess the current vision, and the community's willingness to accomplish that vision. It is crucial to see if there is consensus around that vision or a variant, and to ensure the General Plan (most elements of which were adopted in 2003) is continuing to guide us appropriately, etc.
- 8. Such a session might best be run by an outside facilitator, especially one who is familiar with this type of exercise, and has successfully conducted similar sessions.
- 9. This session would follow the already scheduled January 11 Next Steps Workshop based on the community survey results.
- 10. Then, the Council's session on the fiscal forecast would be the third and final session setting the stage for the initiation of the budget development process.

## **Options**

- 1. Take no action;
- 2. Provide direction to staff on the focus, format, and schedule for a Council Goal-Setting workshop;
- 3. Provide alternative direction to staff;

### **Analysis and Conclusions**

The best approach to such a session will depend on what the Council seeks to accomplish.

The suggested format is as follows:

- A. Staff presentations on governing General Plan concepts/policies, as well as current and expected future issues and opportunities that may influence variation to current goals and policies
- B. Council questions
- C. Public comment
- D. Council discussion and direction to staff.

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The direction received at the Goal-Setting Workshop will guide the budget development process.

# Fiscal Impact

None. If the Council chooses to utilize an outside facilitator, then there would be associated costs.

## Recommendation

Provide direction to staff on the Council's interest in having a goal-setting session to precede the budget process and, if so, the focus, format, and schedule of such a session.
