ROLL CALL VOTE. Motioned by Councilman Gregory, seconded by Councilman Hamon, and passed 4-1 (Councilman Reed opposed) to approve Resolution No. 17-156 reclassifying the second Deputy Building Official position to a second Building Inspector position.

17. Second Reading of City Manager Signature Authority Ordinance

PUBLIC COMMENT. None.

ROLL CALL VOTE #1. Motioned by Councilman Gregory, seconded by Councilman Hamon, and passed unanimously to hold second reading and adopt Ordinance 1046 N.S. to amend Paso Robles Municipal Code Section 6.04.160, allowing the City Council to establish by resolution the maximum limit for professional and specialized services agreements that can be approved by the City Manager.

ROLL CALL VOTE #2. Motioned by Councilman Gregory, seconded by Councilman Hamon, and passed unanimously to approve Resolution No. 17-157 that approves amendments to the City's Purchasing and Payment Procedures Manual to increase the City Manager's signature limit from \$20,000 to \$35,000 for a one-year period. Once implemented, the resolution requires the City Manager to monitor the purchases and contracts that no longer need Council approval and apprise the Council, for a period of one year. At the end of the year, if the Council has not extended the increase or otherwise amended the City's financial and purchasing policies, the limit returns to its previous amount of \$20,000.
