MINUTES OF THE ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING/STUDY SESSION
PASO ROBLES CITY COUNCIL
APRIL 24, 1989

The City Council of the City of El Paso de Robles, meeting in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on the above date, was called to order by Mayor Steve Martin with the following Councilmembers answering roll call: Conway, Dolan, Russell, Reneau and Martin; none being absent.

1. The City Manager reviewed the City's Economic Development Program, and accompanying staff report which included an Economic Development Manager Job Description and estimated budget for the establishment of the Program. He explained that the program would have a primary focus on the establishment and operation of a program for industrial retention, expansion and recruitment while also providing support for the Redevelopment Agency's Program of commercial revitalization and overall enhancement of the City's economic base.

After discussion, it was moved by Councilman Dolan, seconded by Councilman Reneau, and passed unanimously to approve in concept the establishment of a City administered Economic Development Program.

2. The City Manager reviewed a proposed street configuration and parcel designations for the Airport. The primary emphasis of the staff presentation was focused upon Airport land uses (proposed zoning), general policy discussion of funding parcel development and merger of industrial use leases and development process into the Economic Development Program.

At the close of discussion, it was moved by Councilman Russell, seconded by Councilman Conway, and passed unanimously to direct staff to prepare preliminary plans for development of three sections of the Airport on the western and southern borders, identified in the presentation as Areas I, V and VI.

3. There were no public comments.

4. There being no other business, it was moved by Councilman Dolan, seconded by Councilman Reneau and passed unanimously to adjourn.
