

ORDINANCE NO. 128 N.S.

## AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A RECREATION AND CIVIC WELFARE COMMISSION AND PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS AND PRESCRIBING THEIR POWERS AND DUTIES THEREUNDER.

The City Council of the City of El Paso de Robles does ordain as follows;

1. That there is hereby established in and for the City of El Paso de Robles, a commission to be known as the "Recreation and Civic Welfare Commission" which shall consist of seven members, each of whom shall serve without compensation; with one member of the City Council, as appointed by the Mayor, the City Clerk and the Chief of Police being ex-officio members of said commission.

2. The City Council shall forthwith appoint members to the commission with the term of office of the first members so appointed to be determined by lot, so that the term of office of one member shall expire as of June 30, 1948; two members as of June 30, 1949; two members of June 30, 1950; and two members as of June 30, 1951. All new appointments to fill the expired terms shall be appointed by the City Council for a term of four years and a vacancy for any reason on the commission shall be filled by appointment of the City Council with the member so appointed serving for the unexpired term of the member vacating. The City Council may remove any appointed member of said commission from office with or without cause by an affirmative vote of not less than four-fifths (4/5) of all the members of the City Council.

3. The commission shall hold regular meetings at least once each month, in the City Council Chambers of the City Hall, and may hold such additional meetings as it may deem necessary or expedient with a copy of minutes of each meeting furnished the City Council. A majority of said commission members shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of transacting business of the commission. The commission shall as soon as practicable, after the time of their appointment, draw up by-laws which shall become effective after approval by the City Council. At the first meeting of the commission the members shall elect a Chairman, Vice Chairman and

Secretary, who shall serve at the pleasure of the commission.

4. It shall be the general objectives of the commission to encourage, foster, facilitate, establish and maintain a program of supervised playgrounds, athletic fields, recreation centers, and other recreational and civic welfare facilities, equipment and activities within the City and to conduct any recreation or cultural activity that will employ the leisure time of the people in a constructive and wholesome manner.

5. The commission shall have power to:

(a) Recommend the employment and salaries of a director and other employees to the City Council for approval in the operation of its activities and any such employee shall be paid as an employee of the City, under the supervision of the Commission.

(b) Use for recreational purposes any lands or buildings or both, or school property, with the consent of the owner or authority in charge thereof, and not already dedicated and devoted to another or inconsistent public use.

(c) Accept all monies appropriated for its purpose by the City and any other public or quasi-public body, and may accept all gifts and donations, legacies, or bequests from any other source also all rents, charges and income which may be derived from the use of any property or facility. All monies so obtained by the commission shall be paid over to the City Treasurer and deposited in a recreation fund for recreational purposes and shall be paid out only on claims approved by vote of the commission being submitted to the City Council for payment.

6. The commission shall not later than the first day of June each year submit a complete written report to the City Council showing all activities carried on during the preceding year together with all monies received and spent in connection with each such activity, also a tentative budget and outline of a proposed program for the ensuing year.

7. The City Council shall appropriate any funds, and allow the use of and provide any property, real and personal, as it

may deem necessary for the purpose of carrying on the activities of the commission.

8. All ordinances, resolutions, or parts thereof in conflict with this ordinance, are hereby repealed.

9. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid, such decision or decisions shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance, and each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, sub-sections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared invalid.


