WHEREAS, the housing problem continues to be the number one concern of those without adequate housing accomodations, especially returned Veterans, and

WHEREAS, many families are living doubled up with relatives, others in residences they cannot afford and still others in makeshift accompdations, and

WHEREAS, such a situation is detrimental to the health, safety, morals and economic stability of our people, and

WHEREAS, solutions to this serious National problem are being sought through unorganized local effort on a comparatively small scale, and

WHEREAS, there is before the Congress legislation introduced and sponsored by Senator Taft that will meet this issue on an organized National basis,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE

- 1. That the Congress of the United States immediately act upon the proposals set forth in Senate Bill 866 and it's companion measure, House Resolution 2523
- 2. That copies of this Resolution be forwarded to Senator Robert A. Taft; Chairmen, Chas. W. Tobey and Jesse P. Wolcott of the Senate and House Committees on Banking and Currency; California Senators Knowland and Downey; Representative Ernest K. Bramblett from this 11th Congressional District; Honorable Charles K. Fletcher, California Member, House Banking and Currency Committee; Chairman Leo A. Allen, House Rules Committee; Arthur H. Vandenberg, Senate President protem and Joseph W. Martin, Speaker of the House, ATTEST:
