

RESOLUTION NO. 772

CLOSING A PORTION OF FIRST STREET IN
THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of El Paso de Robles, California, having on the 7th day of April, 1952, passed a Resolution of Intention to vacate that portion of First Street in said City, particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the Southerly line of Lot 7, Block 120, distant 10 feet North $86^{\circ} 10'$ East of the Southwest corner of said Lot 7, Block 120 as shown on the Official Map of the City of El Paso de Robles, filed in the office of the County Recorder, February 25, 1889; thence North $86^{\circ} 10'$ East 227.5 feet, more or less, along the Southerly line of said Lot 7 and Lot 6 of said Block 120 to the Westerly right of way line of the Southern Pacific Railroad Right of Way; thence along said right of way line in a Southwesterly direction a distance of 36 feet, more or less, to the center line of First Street; thence South $86^{\circ} 10'$ West along said center line of First Street a distance of 168 feet, more or less; thence North $66^{\circ} 57' 40''$ West a distance of 50 feet to the point of beginning. Further reference is hereby made to a map and plan now on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of El Paso de Robles for particulars as to the proposed vacation.

WHEREAS, it appears that the City Clerk did cause a copy of said Resolution of Intention to be published three successive weeks in the Paso Robles Press as required by law, and

WHEREAS, it appears that the Superintendent of Streets did cause to be conspicuously posted along the line of the portion of First Street as required by law, and

WHEREAS, it further appears that said notices and publications thereof were in all respects as required by the provisions of an act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled "Street Vacation Act of 1941" Division IX Part 3, Chapters 1 and 2 of the Streets and Highways Code, and


WHEREAS, a public hearing has been had on said proposed

vacation as so noticed, and having heard all evidence offered by any persons interested, the City Council finds that the portion of First Street described in the Resolution of Intention is unnecessary for present or prospective public street purposes;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the public easement cease on that portion of First Street herein before described and vacated for public street purposes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk of this City cause a certified copy of this resolution to be recorded in the office of the County Recorder of the County of San Luis Obispo, California.
