

RESOLUTION NO. 794

RESOLUTION TO STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION
REGARDING U. S. HIGHWAY 101

WHEREAS, U. S. Highway 101 from Paso Robles, California, north to the Monterey County border, is heavily travelled, is narrow and is the scene of a substantial number of fatal accidents; and

WHEREAS, since the reactivation of Camp Roberts in August of 1950, the vehicle count has increased tremendously along with the accident rate; and

WHEREAS, the County Civic Association of San Luis Obispo County, California, the Chambers of Commerce of San Luis Obispo and Paso Robles, California, and various other civic bodies recognize the imperative need for four-laning this stretch of highway; and


WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission is holding its monthly meeting in Sacramento from July 15 to July 17, 1952, inclusive;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that Dr. Russell W. Gates, Mayor of the City of El Paso de Robles, and James A. Madden, City Attorney, present this Resolution to the State Highway Commission at said meeting;


RESOLVED FURTHER that Dr. Russell W. Gates and James A. Madden petition the State Highway Commission to give the highest priority to rebuilding U. S. Highway 101 from the North limits of Paso Robles, California, to the Monterey County Line in order to protect the citizens of this County, the military personnel stationed at Camp Roberts, and the motorists from the major metropolitan areas of Los Angeles and San Francisco.
