

RESOLUTION NO. 1239

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 71.

WHEREAS, Californians and out-of-state visitors in increasing numbers are visiting the Hearst Castle State Monument and the adjacent coastal areas of California; and

WHEREAS, the City of El Paso de Robles together with its many thousands of visitors and tourists have long needed an adequate highway connecting Paso Robles with the Coast in the vicinity of Cambria; and

WHEREAS, such a highway when constructed will complete State Sign Route 41 from the Yosemite National Park to the Pacific Ocean at Cambria near the Hearst Monument; and


WHEREAS, residents of all areas of the San Joaquin Valley have expressed their wish to drive to this section of the Coast over a modern and safe highway; and

WHEREAS, Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 71 has been passed unanimously by both Houses of the State Legislature urging the California Highway Commission to allocate funds and to commence construction of this route through the Green Valley;

BE AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of El Paso de Robles that:

1. The City Council of said City wholeheartedly supports Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 71;
2. The City Council respectfully urges the California Highway Commission to finalize the location of said Green Valley Route; and immediately to allocate funds for the early construction of this essential highway.
