

RESOLUTION NO. 1450

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING REBUILDING U. S. HIGHWAY 101
BETWEEN SAN ARDO AND SAN LUCAS, MONTEREY COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS, for many years past U. S. Highway 101 between the Towns of San Ardo and San Lucas in Monterey County has been a narrow and obsolete bottleneck, inadequate to handle the high volume of traffic on U. S. Highway 101, and as a result thereof numerous unnecessary accidents have occurred resulting in a high fatality rate and a high injury and property damage rate; and

WHEREAS, the matter of completion of U. S. Highway 101 from the Mexican Border to the Oregon Border as a modern expressway or freeway is a matter of Statewide and Nationwide concern, since this is one of the major traffic arteries on the Pacific Coast,

BE AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES AS FOLLOWS:

1) This City Council respectfully requests the California State Highway Commission to provide emergency funding to eliminate the 13.4 mile bottleneck on U. S. Highway 101 between San Ardo and San Lucas, Monterey County, California by constructing a modern freeway;

2) That the actual construction be given highest priority and that one contract be let so as to provide for completion not later than July 1, 1970; and

3) That certified copies of this Resolution be forwarded to the following individuals: a) Vernon J. Cristina, Chairman California Highway Commission, b) John Legarra, State Highway Engineer, c) Honorable Vernon L. Sturgeon, d) Honorable William Ketchum, e) Salinas Valley Highway Advisory Council, and f) District Engineer, District V, San Luis Obispo, California.
