

RESOLUTION NO. 95-137

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES
GIVING PERMISSION TO REMOVE OAK TREES AS SUMMARIZED IN THE
ARBORIST REPORT DATED SEPTEMBER 18, 1995 FOR 641 7TH STREET

WHEREAS, the City has received an arborist report dated September 18, 1995; and

WHEREAS, said report has identified one (1) Oak tree which has a severe lean and a large cavity in the main support system; and

WHEREAS, this tree, if not removed, could create a hazardous condition which could result in personal injury and damage to property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the City Council gives permission for the removal of one (1) Oak tree as outlined in the arborist report attached as Exhibit "A".

Section 2. That the applicant is required to install two (2) 24-inch box trees (1½-inch minimum caliper) for each tree removed which is greater than 3-inch diameter.

(2) Large mature Valley Oaks bordering property dominate over this smaller tree which explains the natural lean of this tree. Foliage is lush and green and full. The main stem has a large cavity at the base which extends at least 2' inside of trunk. So the main support of trunk does have some serious defects.
