

RESOLUTION NO.12-083

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PASO ROBLES  
AUTHORIZING A PUBLIC WORKS MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT

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WHEREAS, In October 1989, the Public Works Mutual Aid Agreement (PWMAA) was established to provide a means for public works agencies to receive mutual aid quickly following a catastrophic disaster. The PWMAA was modeled on the fire and law mutual aid systems with the notable exception that the PWMAA requires a local emergency proclamation and the requesting jurisdiction pays for any assistance.

WHEREAS, Throughout the State of California, 19 Counties and 149 Cities have become parties to this Agreement. The initial signatories were Los Angeles and Orange Counties. The County of San Luis Obispo became a member in 2001 and would act as the local coordinator. The following cities/district are members:

- Arroyo Grande
- Grover Beach
- Morro Bay
- Pismo Beach
- San Luis Obispo
- Templeton Community Services District; and

WHEREAS, becoming party to this agreement would establish a clear avenue to receive and/or provide reimbursable voluntary assistance during a declared emergency; and

WHEREAS, participation in the PWMAA is voluntary. An agency is not obligated to provide or deplete its own resources and is expected to utilize its own resources before requesting mutual aid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City Council of the City of El Paso de Robles does hereby enter into a Public Works Mutual Aid Agreement with the Office of Emergency Services.

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
