A RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF EL PASO DE ROBLES TO APPROVE CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT 03-008, AUTHORIZING CONVERSION OF A RESIDENCE TO AN OFFICE PROFESSIONAL LAND USE (1545 PARK STREET – HH&G PROPERTIES LLC, JAMES R. GATES) ASSESSOR PARCEL NOS: 008-321-014, -015, AND -016

WHEREAS, Chapter 21.18A (Office Professional Overlay) of the Zoning Code of the City of El Paso de Robles requires Planning Commission approval of a Conditional Use Permit to establish a professional or medical office on the site at 1545 Park Street;

WHEREAS, Mr. James R. Gates has filed a Conditional Use Permit application on behalf of HH&G Properties, LLC seeking authorization to convert an existing 1419 square foot residence at 1545 Park Street to a professional office;

WHEREAS, 1545 Park Street is located at the southwest corner of 16th and Park Streets in the Downtown area;

WHEREAS, the site has three (3) separate residential buildings and only one of these buildings has off-street parking provided via a carport;

WHEREAS, the General Plan designation of the site is RMF-M (Residential Multi-Family, Medium) with an OP (Office Professional) Overlay;

WHEREAS, the base zoning of the site is R3 (Multi-Family Residential) with an OP (Office Professional Overlay);

WHEREAS, Section 21.18A.010 (Purpose) of Chapter 21.18A (Office Professional Overlay District) states that the office professional overlay district is intended to retain and provide for residential uses as the primary use in accordance with the base residential district (e;g. R2 or R3), and is also intended to act as a transitional district which could accommodate mixed office and residential uses;

WHEREAS, Section 21.18A.010 (Purpose) of Chapter 21.18A (Office Professional Overlay District) further states that a conditional use permit for a professional or medical office use (or other related commercial service or retail uses ancillary to office) may be approved if neighborhood compatibility and preservation of residential character can be demonstrated;

WHEREAS, at its July 22, 2003 meeting, the Planning Commission held a duly noticed public hearing on the proposal to establish a professional office on the subject site at 1545 Park Street, to accept public testimony on the proposal, and to review the site specific circumstances involved;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Statutes and Guidelines of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), and the City's Procedures for Implementing CEQA, the proposal is exempt from environmental review per Section 15303 of the State CEQA Guidelines; an Initial Study was prepared and circulated for public review and comment;

WHEREAS, based upon the facts and analysis presented in the staff report and attachments thereto, the public testimony received, and subject to the Conditions of Approval listed below, the Planning Commission finds that:

- 1. The establishment, maintenance, and operation of the requested land use (a professional office), will be adequately controlled so as to assure that the area:
 - ➤ Will retain its residential characteristics as intended by the General Plan and Zoning;
 - ➤ Will be compatible with the neighborhood;
 - ➤ Will preserve the residential character since the building façade and elevations will not be altered in any substantive manner, but rather will be painted and restored with sensitivity to the original design.
- 2. The establishment, maintenance, and operation of the requested land use (a professional office) will not, under the circumstances of the particular case, be detrimental to the public welfare of the City and of the persons residing or working in the neighborhood setting nor will it be injurious to property or improvements in the neighborhood.
- 3. The establishment, maintenance, and operation of the requested land use (a professional office) will be compatible with area development and the neighborhood with adherence to the standard and site specific conditions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Planning Commission of the City of El Paso de Robles does hereby approve Conditional Use Permit 03-008 subject to the following conditions:

SITE SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

- 1. The Conditional Use Permit for the professional office at 1545 Park Street shall not be operative or vested until:
 - A. A reciprocal parking agreement has been recorded and put into effect guaranteeing the provision of off-site parking in the amount of three (3) spaces devoted for specific use by the office professional use in a manner and form acceptable to the City; and

- B. All building and site improvements (as may be required by the City in order to meet code requirements, including but not limited to the Uniform Building Code and the Uniform Fire Code are to be made to the satisfaction of the Community Development Director or his designee, as may be required as a condition of permit issuance and/or these conditions.
- C. The applicant shall construct a new curb return with a handicap ramp in accordance with City Standards and Specifications at the southwest corner of 16th and Park Streets. The applicant shall remove and replace existing curbs as directed by the City Engineer
- D. The applicant shall enter into an agreement not to protest the formation of an assessment district for their share of relocating existing overhead utilities underground in their neighborhood.
- 2. The maintenance and operation of the professional office shall comply with Section 21.21.040 (General Performance Standards for all uses) of Chapter 21.21 (Performance Standards) of the Zoning Ordinance. These performance standards address the following:
 - o Fire and explosion hazards
 - o Radioactivity or electrical disturbance
 - o Noise
 - Vibration
 - o Smoke
 - o Odors, fly ash, dust fumes
 - o Glare
 - o Liquid or solid wastes
 - o Transportation system impacts.
- 3. The maintenance and operation of the professional office shall comply with all Conditions of Approval and Exhibits contained in this Resolution. The site and exterior alterations shall be in substantial conformance with the following Exhibits:

- 4. This Conditional Use Permit authorizes use of the existing residence at 1545 Park Street as a professional office with up to 1419 square feet of leasable space.
- 5. This Conditional Use Permit shall run with the land.
- 6. Any condition imposed by the Planning Commission in granting this Conditional Use Permit may be modified or eliminated, or new conditions may be added, provided that the Planning Commission shall first conduct a public hearing in the same manner as required for the granting of the original permit. No such modification shall be made unless the Commission finds that such modification is necessary to protect the public interest and/or neighboring properties, or, in the case of deletion of an existing condition, that such action is necessary to permit reasonable operation and use under the Conditional Use Permit.
- 7. All landscaped areas that are visible from public streets shall be kept in a neat manner at all times and the landscaping shall be continuously maintained in a healthy and thriving condition.
- 8. Prior to issuance of a permit to modify the building, the Development Review Committee shall review and approve a Final, Precise Development Plan and associated detailed plans. Part
- 9. Outdoor areas may not be used for the conduct of business without first obtaining the written approval of the Community Development Director or his designee.

The following conditions that have been checked are standard conditions of approval for the above referenced project. The checked conditions shall be complied with in their entirety before the project can be finalized, unless otherwise specifically indicated. In addition, there may be site specific conditions of approval that apply to this project in the resolution.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT: The applicant shall contact the Community Development Department at (805) 237-3970 for compliance with the following conditions:

A. GENERAL CONDITIONS:

- 1. This project approval shall expire on July 22, 2005 unless a time extension request is filed with the Community Development Department prior to expiration.
- Z. The site shall be developed and maintained in accordance with the approved plans and unless specifically provided for through the Planned Development process shall not waive compliance with any sections of the Zoning Code, all other applicable City Ordinances, and applicable Specific Plans.
- 4. Any site specific condition imposed by the Planning Commission in approving this project may be modified or eliminated, or new conditions may be added, provided that the Planning Commission shall first conduct a public hearing in the same manner as required for the approval of this project. No such modification shall be made unless the Commission finds that such modification is necessary to protect the public interest and/or neighboring properties, or, in the case of deletion of an existing condition, that such action is necessary to permit reasonable operation and use for this approval.

- ☐ 5. This project is subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) which requires the applicant submit a \$25.00 filing fee for the Notice of Determination payable to "County of San Luis Obispo". The fee should be submitted to the Community Development Department within 24 hours of project approval which is then forwarded to the San Luis Obispo County Clerk. Please note that the project may be subject to court challenge unless the required fee is paid.
- All signs shall be subject to review and approval as required by Municipal Code Section 21.19 and shall require a separate application and approval prior to installation of any sign.
- 8. All outdoor storage shall be screened from public view by landscaping and walls or fences per Section 21.21.110 of the Municipal Code.
- 9. All trash enclosures shall be constructed of decorative masonry block compatible with the main buildings. Gates shall be view obscuring and constructed of durable materials such as painted metal or chain link with plastic slatting.
- All existing and/or new ground-mounted appurtenances such as air-conditioning condensers, electrical transformers, backflow devices etc., shall be screened from public view through the use of decorative walls and/or landscaping subject to approval by the Community Development Director or his designee. Details shall be included in the building plans.
- All existing and/or new roof appurtenances such as air-conditioning units, grease hoods, etc. shall be screened from public view. The screening shall be architecturally integrated with the building design and constructed of compatible materials to the satisfaction of the Community Development Director or his designee. Details shall be included in the building plans.
- All existing and/or new lighting shall be shielded so as to be directed downward in such a manner as to not create off-site glare or adversely impact adjacent properties. The style, location and height of the lighting fixtures shall be submitted with the building plans and shall be subject to approval by the Community Development Director or his designee.
- ☐ All existing and/or new landscaping shall be installed with automatic irrigation systems.
- All walls/fences and exposed retaining walls shall be constructed of decorative materials which include but are not limited to splitface block, slumpstone, stuccoed block, brick, wood, crib walls or other similar materials as determined by the Development Review Committee, but specifically excluding precision block.

	1.	The applicant shall enter into an Engineering Plan Check and Inspection Services Agreement with the City.
E.	PRIO	R TO ISSUANCE OF A GRADING PERMIT:
	1.	Prior to approval of a grading plan, the developer shall apply through the City, to FEMA and receive a Letter of Map Amendment (LOMA) issued from FEMA. The developer's engineer shall provide the required supporting data to justify the application.
	2.	The proposed structures and grading shall not encroach into the 100-year floodway as specified in Municipal Code Chapter 21.14 "Flood Damage Prevention Regulations".
	3.	Any existing Oak trees located on the project site shall be protected and preserved as required in City Ordinance No. 553, Municipal Code No. 10.01 "Oak Tree Preservation", unless specifically approved to be removed. An Oak tree inventory shall be prepared listing the Oak trees, their disposition, and the proposed location of any replacement trees required. This form must be completed by a land surveyor, engineer or architect licensed in the State California.

	4.	All top soil removed shall be stockpiled and evenly distributed over the slopes and lots upon completion of rough grading to support hydroseeding and landscaping. All slope areas shall be protected against erosion by hydroseeding or landscaping.
	5.	The applicant shall install all street names, traffic signs and traffic striping as directed by the City Engineer.

6.	If the adjoining existing City street is inadequate for the traffic generated by the project, or will be severely damaged by the construction, the applicant shall remove the entire roadway and replace it with a minimum full half-width street plus a 12' wide travel lane and 8' wide graded shoulder adequate to provide for two-way traffic. (A finding of "rough proportionality" has been made in the resolution for this condition).
7.	If the development includes a phased street construction along the project boundary for future completion by the adjacent property owner, the applicant shall provide a minimum half-width street plus a 12' wide travel lane and 4' wide graded shoulder adequate for two-way traffic. (A finding of "rough proportionality" has been made in the resolution for this condition).
8.	When the project fronts on an existing street, the applicant shall pave-out from the proposed curb to the edge of pavement if the existing pavement section is adequate, and shall feather the new paving out to the centerline for a smooth transition. If the existing pavement is inadequate, the roadway shall be replaced to centerline and the remaining pavement shall be overlaid. (A finding of "rough proportionality" has been made in the resolution for this condition).
9.	Any utility trenching in existing streets shall be overlaid to restore a smooth riding surface as required by the City Engineer. Boring and jacking rather than trenching may be required on newly constructed or heavily traveled City streets.
10.	The applicant shall install all utilities (sewer, water, gas, electricity, cable TV and telephone) underground (as shown on the composite utility plan). Street lights shall be installed at locations as required by the City Engineer. All existing overhead utilities adjacent to or within the project shall be relocated underground except for electrical lines 77 kilovolts or greater. All utilities shall be extended to the boundaries of the project. All underground construction shall be completed and approved by the public utility companies, and the subgrade shall be scarified and compacted, before paving the streets.
11.	Prior to paving any street the water and sewer systems shall successfully pass a pressure test. The sewer system shall also be tested by a means of a mandrel and video inspection with a copy of the video tape provided to the City. No paving shall occur until the City has reviewed and viewed the sewer video tape and has determined that the sewerline is acceptable. Any repair costs to the pipeline including trench paving restoration shall be at the developer's expense.
12.	A blackline clear Mylar (0.4 MIL) copy and a blueline print of as-built improvement plans, signed by the engineer of record, shall be provided to the City Engineer prior to the final inspection. A reduced copy (i.e. 1" = 100') of the composite utility plan shall be provided to update the City's Atlas Map.

	13.	All construction refuse shall be separated (i.e. concrete, asphalt concrete, wood gypsum board, etc.) and removed from the project in accordance with the City's Source Reduction and Recycling Element.

	1.	Fire hydrants shall be installed at intervals as required by the Fire Chief and City Engineer. The maximum spacing for single family residential shall be 500 feet. The maximum spacing for multi-family and commercial/residential shall be 300 feet. On-site hydrants shall be placed as required by the Fire Chief.
	2.	Building permits shall not be issued until the water system, including hydrants, has been tested and accepted and a based access road installed sufficient to support the City's fire apparatus (HS-20 truck loading). The access road shall be kept clear to a minimum of 24 feet at all times and shall be extended to each lot and shall be maintained to provide all weather driving conditions.
	3.	No buildings shall be occupied until all improvements are completed and accepted by the City for maintenance.
	4.	If the development includes phased street construction, temporary turn-arounds shall be provided for streets that exceed 150 feet in length. The temporary turn around shall meet City requirements as set forth in the Public Works Department Standards and Specifications.
	5.	All open space areas to be dedicated to the City shall be inspected by the Fire Department prior to acceptance. A report shall be submitted recommending action needed for debris, brush and weed removal and tree trimming. The developer shall clean out all debris, dead limbs and trash from areas to be recorded as open space prior to acceptance into a Benefit Maintenance District.
	6.	Any open space included in a private development shall be subject to the approval of a vegetation management plan approved by the Fire Chief.
	7.	Each tract or phase shall provide two sources of water and two points of access unless otherwise determined by the Fire Chief and Public Works Director.
